Silverstone Fire safety information





Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service wants everyone to have fun and enjoy a safe race weekend. Please follow the fire safety advice below to minimise the risk of a fire starting during your time at Silverstone.

Fire safety tips:

- Know your campsite's fire safety plans and check where the nearest telephone is
- Ensure caravans and large tents are at least six metres apart and away from parked cars
- If you use a barbecue, take extra care don't use on dry ground, or anywhere near tents or other flammable materials such as long grass
- Never bring a barbecue into a tent. They emit deadly carbon monoxide (CO) gas for hours after use
- Never smoke in a tent. Always fully extinguish smoking materials and dispose of cigarette ends in proper bins
- Never leave glass in sunlight reflected rays can start a fire
- Remind everyone how to put out clothing that's on fire – stop, drop and roll
- Do keep water nearby to assist in the event of a fire
- If you spot a fire, call 999 immediately early detection can prevent it escalating into a large incident

Did you know?

- A fire can destroy a tent in less than 60 seconds
- In England, on average 27,000 fires are started on grass, heathland and moorland every year. This is an average of 73 fires per day!
- On average, 360 fires per year occur in caravans with 50,000 fires occuring in refuse and rubbish containers

Northamptonshire Police will be at Silverstone to ensure you are safe during the race weekend. Please follow the crime prevention advice below to make sure you have a crime-free experience.

Crime prevention tips:

- Don't leave your valuables in your tent when it is unattended
- Leave your tent untidy; don't make it easy for a thief to grab a bag with everything in it
- When you're in your tent, secure zip pulls together with a padlock, to stop anyone getting inside
- Remove your wallet or purse from any clothing and hide money close to you while you sleep. Consider investing in a money belt that you can wear while you sleep
- Don't leave any property on display in vehicles. What is not valuable to you may be valuable to someone else
- Be aware of your surroundings and who is around you when you are paying for things
- While walking around the Silverstone site and campsites try and stay with friends, especially at night
- By all means, please have a good time, but remember that drinking too much alcohol hampers your judgment – one drink too many can lead to problems – not least forgetting where your tent is. You can also become prone to assault or robbery when drunk – so try not to have too much and keep aware of your surroundings
